

Cable tray 9-yard naming convention

In BIM or Revit MEP systems, the naming may follow a template-based approach: Control Number + Purpose + Material + Abbreviation

Example: 102-POW-AL-VT (Control 102, Power, Aluminum, Ventilated Tray)

This ensures consistency across projects and simplifies selection in type selectors or project browsers.

Best Practices

- Use consistent units:** Always specify length in yards, feet, or meters according to project standards.
- Include purpose:** Helps distinguish between power, data, or instrumentation trays.
- Follow project or manufacturer standards:** Many manufacturers, like Eaton B-Line, provide part numbers and naming templates for their trays.
- Document in drawings and schedules:** Ensure the naming convention is reflected in installation drawings, BOMs, and BIM models for clarity.

By following these conventions, a 9-yard cable tray can be clearly identified, reducing errors during design, procurement, and installation.
