4. Waterstop at Slab Penetrations At floor or slab penetrations, a metal or polymer waterstop of at least 50 mm in height is recommended. This is often combined with firestopping materials such as mineral wool or firestop mastic to ensure both waterproofing and fire safety. Proper installation requires sealing all gaps tightly and using backing plates for large openings.

Installation Considerations Ensure the frame or sill is structurally supported and aligned with the cable tray. Apply sealants evenly to prevent cracks or voids. For roof penetrations, use service risers or upstands to maintain a watertight seal. Maintain accessibility for cable maintenance; modular frames allow opening without removing the entire seal.
