Tray Selection: Choose appropriate tray types (ladder, perforated, solid-bottom, or wire mesh) based on cable type, airflow, and environmental conditions. Fill and Ampacity Considerations: Avoid overfilling trays; derate ampacity when multiple current-carrying conductors are stacked or bundled.
