- Material Compatibility:** Metal junction boxes can cause reflections or stray light if used with optical components. Nonmetallic or coated interiors may be preferable to reduce optical interference.
- Safety and Code Compliance:** Any modification to a junction box must comply with local electrical and safety codes.
