- SFP or SFP+ Transceivers:** Small form-factor pluggable modules can be inserted into compatible switches or routers to convert between copper and fiber connections. They are commonly used in enterprise networks and data centers.
- Fiber Switches:** Switches with both fiber and Ethernet ports can bridge networks, allowing fiber connections to interface with copper-based devices.

Typical Setup Example Fiber to Ethernet via ONT: In home fiber installations, an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) converts the incoming fiber signal to Ethernet. You then connect your router using a standard Ethernet cable.

Enterprise Networks: Use a fiber media converter or a switch with SFP ports to connect fiber optic backbone cables to copper Ethernet devices, ensuring proper signal conversion and network compatibility.
