Update the router firmware for optimal performance. Configure Wi-Fi settings, including SSID and password, and enable Quality of Service (QoS) if needed for video calls or gaming.

Step 5: Verify the Connection Check that the ONT and router lights indicate a stable connection. Test internet access on a device connected via Wi-Fi or Ethernet. If the connection fails, ensure all cables are securely connected and the ONT is properly registered with your ISP.
