

Copper wire fiber optic cable connection

Prepare the Equipment: Ensure you have the media converter, fiber optic cables, Ethernet cables, and any required SFP modules. Verify compatibility with your network standards and data rates.

Connect the Fiber Side: Plug the fiber optic cable into the converter's fiber port or SFP transceiver. Ensure the transmit (TX) and receive (RX) paths are correctly aligned; reversing them will prevent connectivity.

Connect the Copper Side: Use an Ethernet cable to connect the converter's RJ45 port to your copper-based device, such as a switch, router, or PC. Choose cables appropriate for your network speed (Cat6 for 1G, Cat6a or Cat7 for 10G).

Power On and Configure: Connect the media converter to a stable power source. Some models may require configuration via a web interface or management software to adjust duplex mode, data rate, or VLAN settings.

Verify Connectivity: Check indicator lights on the converter to confirm proper signal transmission and ensure network devices...
