

Core Switch Installation Method

Core switch installation involves careful planning, physical mounting, cabling, configuration, and integration with existing network infrastructure to ensure optimal performance and security.

Pre-Installation Planning Before installation, review the existing network topology and infrastructure to determine the number of switches required and their placement in the network. Physical Installation

Rack Mounting: Mount the switch in a stable rack, preferably at the bottom if it is the only unit, and ensure the heaviest components are at the bottom to maintain stability. Use the correct mounting hardware and follow local electrical codes.

Clearance and Ventilation: Maintain at least 3 inches (7.6 cm) of clearance around ventilation openings to prevent airflow restriction. Ensure the ambient temperature does not exceed manufacturer specifications and humidity is controlled.

Cabling: Route cables away from electrical noise sources and ensure sufficient access to ports and power connections. For stacked switches, ensure proper connection of FlexStack or redundant power supply cables.

Configuration

VLAN and Interface Setup: Create VLANs for interconnection with firewalls and other network devices. Configure VLANIF interfaces and bind them to VPN instances if required.

Routing Protocols: Configure OSPF or other routing protocols to enable connectivity between the user network and egress routers through the core switch.

Firewall Integration: Integrate the core switch with existing firewalls, configuring port settings, access control, and secure communication protocols.

Migration and Verification

De-Rack and Replace: If replacing an existing switch, carefully migrate fiber and Ethernet cables to the new switch.
