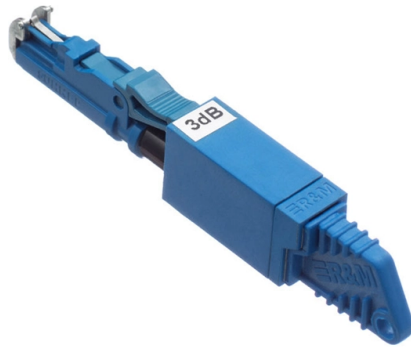

Lockout/Tagout Required – Instructs workers to follow lockout/tagout procedures before servicing. Disconnect Before Servicing – Ensures equipment is de-energized prior to maintenance. Placement Guidelines Signs should be mounted at eye level (5–6 feet) for maximum visibility. Place near electrical panels, transformers, high-voltage equipment, and enclosures. Ensure signs are visible before entering hazardous areas, giving personnel time to take precautions. Materials and Durability Common materials include aluminum, plastic, PVC, and adhesive vinyl. Outdoor signs should be weather-resistant and durable, while reflective or vinyl options enhance visibility in low-light conditions. Signs can be customized with voltage levels, specific instructions, or access restrictions to match facility requirements. Compliance and Standards Signs should comply with OSHA 1910.145, ANSI Z535 series, and NFPA requirements. Use standardized colors and symbols to ensure rapid hazard recognition: red for danger, orange for warning, yellow for caut...
