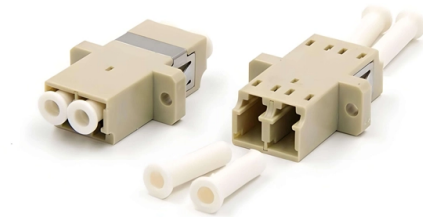


Fiber optic cable and ODF terminal

- Splicing:** Fibers are joined via fusion or mechanical splicing, with splices stored in protective trays.
- Patching:** Patch cords connect fibers to equipment or other network segments.
- Distribution:** Fibers are routed to their final destinations, such as subscriber premises or network nodes.
- Protection:** Shields fibers from dust, moisture, bending, and mechanical stress.

ODFs come in rack-mounted, wall-mounted, modular, and outdoor weatherproof designs, allowing scalability and efficient maintenance.

Fiber Optic Terminal Box A fiber optic terminal box is a smaller enclosure, often installed at the user end or building level, providing fusion splicing, pigtail connections, and mechanical protection for individual fibers. It is commonly used in FTTH networks to connect the main distribution cable to subscriber lines.
