

Gateway of the core switch

Configuration Example: In a typical enterprise network, the core switch may have multiple VLAN interfaces (SVIs). Each SVI can have its own IP address for routing within the VLAN, but the gateway IP is usually set to the upstream router's interface that connects to the broader network or internet.

Redundancy: In high-availability networks, core switches often use protocols like HSRP or VRRP to provide a virtual gateway IP, ensuring continuous connectivity if one router fails.

Collapsed Core Architecture: In smaller networks, a high-performance distribution switch may act as both core and distribution, and the gateway IP would point to the router handling external traffic.
