Installation and Form Factor These splitters are compact and flexible, suitable for installation in corridor information boxes, wall-mounted cabinets, or 1U rack-mounted enclosures. They can be connected using standard fiber connectors such as LC, SC, MPO, or FC, and may include LGX or 19-inch rack options for larger deployments. Some splitters also integrate optical filtering structures to manage specific wavelengths, improving network identification and testing efficiency.
