

How far to lay fiber optic cable

Sag Allowance: For aerial or outdoor installations, a common practice is to allow approximately 2.5 feet of sag for a 150-foot span. This accounts for thermal expansion and contraction, preventing excessive tension that could damage fibers.

Joint Use and Pole Clearances: When installing fiber on utility poles, minimum separation distances between drilled holes and other utilities must be observed to maintain structural integrity and safety.
