Adapters are fixed to the front panel, and bend radius control clips are used to maintain proper fiber curvature. Any excess fiber from the line side or pigtails can be coiled and stored safely within the box.

Step 5: Final Checks and Protection After all fibers are connected, the box is closed, ensuring that fibers are protected from dust, bending, or accidental handling. Prope...
