

How to bind optical fibers using a fiber optic cable conduit puller

Step 3: Apply Lubrication Apply a fiber-cable-rated lubricant at the conduit entrance and at intermediate pull points if needed. Lubrication reduces friction, often lowering pulling tension by 50% or more, and prevents damage to the cable jacket. Choose a lubricant compatible with both the cable jacket and conduit material.

Step 4: Set Up the Conduit Puller Use a hydraulic or motorized conduit puller with load-sensing capabilities to monitor tension. Set the maximum tension limit according to the cable manufacturer's specifications (typically 270–600 lbs for standard fiber cable). Ensure the puller's electronic load cell or dynamometer is calibrated to provide accurate tension readings.

Step 5: Pull the Cable Maintain a steady, moderate pulling speed (approximately 50–100 feet per minute) to avoid tension spikes. Monitor the tension continuously and stop immediately if the maximum limit is approached. Ensure the cable does not bend below its minimum bend radius at any point, especially at cond...
