

How to connect a fiber optic cable to a regular network cable and a router

Link ONT to Router: Use a standard Ethernet cable (Cat5e, Cat6, or higher) to connect the ONT's Ethernet/LAN port to your router's WAN port.

Power On Devices: Turn on the ONT first, wait for the status lights to stabilize, then power on the router. Verify connectivity through the router's indicator lights or configuration interface.

Alternative Using SFP/SFP+ Ports

Some routers have SFP or SFP+ ports that allow direct insertion of a fiber transceiver module. In this case:

Insert a compatible SFP/SFP+ transceiver into the router port.

Connect the fiber optic cable to the transceiver. The transceiver converts the optical signal to an electrical signal for the router.
