

How to connect a home fiber optic cable to a switch

Step 4: Connect the Fiber Cable Use duplex fiber cables (two strands) for most SFP modules, with LC connectors being the most common. Clean the fiber ends before connecting to prevent signal loss. Connect the send port of the transceiver to the receive port on the other device, and vice versa, to ensure proper signal flow.

Step 5: Connect the Other End Attach the other end of the fiber cable to the corresponding device, which could be another switch, a router, or a media converter. If using a patch panel, connect the fiber to the panel first, then to the device.

Step 6: Test the Connection Once connected, check the switch's port LEDs or management interface to confirm the fiber link is active. Troubleshoot by verifying module compatibility, fiber type, and connector cleanliness if the link does not establish.
