Installation Methods

ADSS Installation: Mounted below power conductors on poles or towers using non-metallic hardware. These cables are self-supporting, allowing long spans without additional support, and can be installed in a single pass.

OPGW/OPPC Installation: Installed in the same position as regular conductors. Splicing is performed on the ground, and fibers are protected in enclosures. Only experienced utility personnel should handle installation due to the combination of high voltage and fiber optics.

OPAC Installation: Wrapped around existing conductors using a tug or lasher. Extra fiber length is provided to prevent stress, and the cable jacket is designed to withstand abrasion, temperature...
