Residential or Industrial Units: Fixed tertiary boxes are preferred for permanent installations, ensuring reliable and secure power delivery to appliances. Two-Layer Protection: Both mobile and fixed tertiary boxes are integrated into a two-layer protection system, with RCDs at both the tertiary and secondary levels to prevent electrical hazards. In summary, the third-level distribution box is not inherently fixed; it can be designed as either mobile or stationary depending on the project's power distribution needs and safety requirements.

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Generally, the first-level distribution box is required to be installed in a place with a relatively high terrain, dry and ventilated, and the second-level and third-level distribution boxes
