Network Topologies Star topology: All switches connect to a central switch, minimizing collisions and simplifying management. Daisy chain (cascade): Switches are connected sequentially; practical for small networks but recommended to limit to four layers to avoid latency and signal degradation. Tree topology: Combines star and cascade, suitable for campus networks with multiple buildings.

Installation Tips Verify that all switches support the same fiber mode (single or multimode) and wavelength. Ensure SFP modules are compatible with the switch and fiber type. Reverse connections between SFP ports when using duplex fiber (A to B, B to A) to maintain proper send/receive alignment. Test each link for signal integrity and bandwidth before full deployment. Consider future scalability by using multi-strand fiber or additional SFP slots for easy expansion.
