

Minimum distance between fire protection pipes and cable trays



Overview

This design note adopts a 300 mm horizontal air-gap separation between primary and secondary life-safety trays on roofs, based on these regulatory requirements and established UK guidance. Failure to maintain sufficient spacing can result in several critical issues that could affect the safety and functionality of the installation. Let's explore why this. Although BS 7671 touches on the subject of cable supports, it does not detail specifically what these support distances should be. Distance between fire-fighting cable trays and ordinary cable trays

The maximum deformation of the cable trays in the event of fire must be minimised in order to reduce the height of the installation, whilst taking the minimum distance to the false ceiling into account.

Minimum Service Distances / Spacing

Fire Dampers should be maintained within a separate seal. Every effort should be made to keep a minimum 200mm separation to other Fire Dampers, Ducts or typical penetrating services.
