

Mixed Connection of Access Layer Switches



AI Overview

Mixed connections of access layer switches involve combining Layer 2 and Layer 3 links, using access and trunk ports, and implementing redundancy while preventing loops for reliable network operation.

Overview of Access Layer Switch Connections

Access layer switches are the first point of connectivity for end devices such as PCs, IP phones, and wireless access points. They can operate in Layer 2 mode to provide VLAN adjacency or in Layer 3 mode to support routing at the edge. A mixed connection setup typically involves:

- Access ports:** Connect end devices and carry untagged traffic for a specific VLAN.
- Trunk ports:** Interconnect switches and carry multiple VLANs, allowing VLAN extension across the access layer.
- Layer 2 adjacency:** Required for NIC teaming, high-availability clusters, and certain applications that depend on being in the same broadcast domain.

Mixed Layer 2 and Layer 3 Deployment

In a mixed configuration, some interfaces on access switches may operate in Layer 2 mode while others operate in Layer 3 mode. Key points include:

- Layer 2 and Layer 3 interfaces cannot share the same physical port simultaneously, but separate physical interfaces can be configured for each mode.
- Mixed mode allows independent operation of Layer 2 VLANs and Layer 3 routed interfaces, but routing between Layer 2 VLANs and Layer 3 interfaces requires a distribution or core layer router.

This setup is useful when some devices require VLAN adjacency while others need routed connectivity.

Redundancy and Loop Prevention

To ensure high availability and prevent network loops:

- Spanning Tree Protocol (STP) or Multiple Spanning Tree Protocol (MSTP) should be enabled on all Layer 2 links to prevent loops.
- Dual uplinks from access switches to aggregation/distribution switches can provide redundancy.
