

Nine Prohibitions for Telecommunication Towers



AI Overview

- 4. Unsafe Fall Zones**Towers cannot be erected without ensuring adequate fall zones. Prohibiting construction without proper clearance prevents damage to surrounding infrastructure and protects public safety.
- 5. Ignoring RF Safety Limits**Operating towers that exceed prescribed radio frequency (RF) emission limits is prohibited. Compliance with federal RF safety standards is mandatory to protect workers and the public.
- 6. Unauthorized Modifications**Modifying or upgrading towers without regulatory approval, including adding antennas or structural changes, is prohibited. Section 704 of the Telecommunications Act restricts local interference but requires adherence to federal safety standards.
- 7. Environmental and Cultural Violations**Construction that damages protected ecosystems, heritage sites, or violates environmental regulations is prohibited. Environmental impact assessments are often mandatory before approval.
