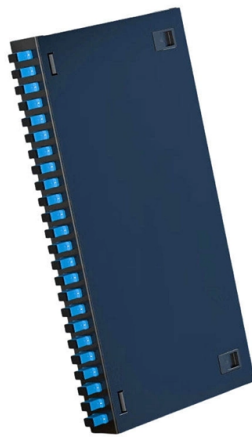


Single-mode fiber optic protection level standard



Overview

652 is the global baseline standard for single-mode optical fiber. It defines the geometrical, optical, and transmission characteristics of SMF, particularly optimized for operation at 1310 nm with low attenuation. Main features: Low loss, zero dispersion at 1310 nm, wide. This Recommendation describes a single-mode optical fibre and cable which has zero-dispersion wavelength around 1310 nm and can be used in the 1310 nm and 1550 nm regions. All three fiber types are characterized as “ low-water peak ”, meaning the maximum attenuation requirement at 1383 nm is equivalent to the maximum attenuation specified at 1310 nm.
