NEC (NFPA 70) and CEC (C22.1 Part 1) cover installation requirements for safe application of cable trays, including ampacity considerations, conductor spacing, and support methods. NFPA 79 and NFPA 70E provide additional guidance for industrial machinery and electrical safety.

Support Construction and Installation

Standard support constructions include:

- Ceiling-mounted supports:** Using pendant brackets, cantilever brackets, or C-profile rails with threaded rod suspensions for flexibility and load distribution.
- Wall-mounted supports:** Brackets and channel supports designed to maintain tray alignment and spacing.
- Floor-mounted supports:** Adjustable stands or pedestals to accommodate cable routing and weight.
