Each OLT port can support multiple ONUs, with split ratios ranging from 1:32 to 1:128 depending on the PON standard (GPON, XGS-PON, etc.).
- Security and Fault Management:** Modern OLTs incorporate security management, monitoring, and fault detection to maintain network reliability and protect subscriber data. They can also support redundancy through dual power supplies and modular designs for high-availability deployments.
- Scalability and Deployment:** OLTs can be deployed in various forms, including box-type for small-scale networks or rack-mounted for large-scale telecom operations. They support multiple PONs simultaneously, enabling service providers to connect hundreds or thousands of users over a single fiber infrastructure.
