A switch panel can be installed on the side of a distribution box if it meets NEC clearance, accessibility, and mounting requirements, ensuring safe operation and maintenance.

Key Considerations

Panelboard vs Switchboard: A distribution box may contain a switchboard (large, floor-mounted, freestanding) or a panelboard (wall-mounted, smaller distribution cabinet). Switchboards handle higher currents and multiple feeders, while panelboards provide branch circuit protection for downstream loads.

Mounting and Accessibility: NEC 110.26 requires a minimum working space of 30 inches wide, 36 inches deep, and 6.5 feet high in front of the panel. The panelboard door must open fully to 90° without obstruction. Any switch panel mounted on the side must not block this working space or access to the main distribution box.

Height and Clearance: Panelboards should be mounted no higher than 6 ft 7 in (≈ 2 meters) from the floor. Dedicated space from the floor to 6 ft is required for safe operation. Equipment in front of the panel, including side-mounted switches, should not extend more than 6 inches beyond the panelboard face to comply with NEC 2023 codes.

Wiring Entry: Cables can enter the switchboard from the top, bottom, or through a dedicated pull structure. Side-mounted panels must allow proper routing of conductors without crowding or bending beyond manufacturer specifications. Ensure that high-leg conductors in 4-wire delta systems are correctly identified and terminated according to NEC 408.3(E)(1) and 110.15.

Safety and Qualified Personnel: Only qualified personnel trained in de-energizing, grounding, and tagging circuits should perform installation. Follow NFPA 70E safety practices, use appropriate PPE, and ensure the equipment is de-energized before installation.

Labeling and Identification: All panels, including side-mounted switches, must be pe...
