How Neutral Wires Are Connected

Three-phase systems: The neutral is connected to the star point of the transformer or generator and may carry a compensating current if the phases are unbalanced. When loads are symmetrical, the neutral current is zero; if asymmetrical, the neutral carries the imbalance.

Safety and Grounding

The neutral busbar is typically bonded to the earth at the main distribution point. This ensures that the neutral remains at or near ground potential, reducing the risk of electric shock and stabilizing the system voltage. Proper earthing is critical for the safe operation of RCCBs and MCBs, which protect against leakage and overcurrent.
