

Trunk Line Classification and Optical Cable Models

- Polarity and Gender:** Polarity methods (A, B, C) and key orientation (up/down) must be specified. Gender is typically female-female with pinned cassettes.

- MTP/MPO High-Fiber-Count Trunks:** Pre-terminated, plug-and-play, with bend-resistant fibers and low insertion loss (~0.35 dB typical). Available with LSZH, OFNR, or OFNP jackets.
- OptoTrunk Cables:** Combine multiple cables into one, using high-density connectors like 144F Expanded Beam Optical (EBO) or LC cartridges. Lengths range from 10 to 100 meters or more, supporting rapid installation and maintenance.
- Bundle Configurations:** For example, a 12-fiber trunk with 2 bundles equals 24 fibers; a 24-fiber trunk with 2 bundles equals 48 fibers. Cable diameter varies with bundle count.
