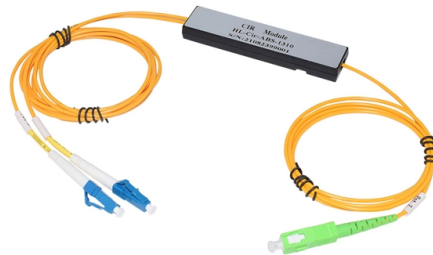


Unused optical fiber cores
