

Why isn't there a router with fiber optic cable connected

Power the ONT: Plug in the ONT and wait for the status lights to stabilize (usually 2–5 minutes).

Connect ONT to Router: Use an Ethernet cable to link the ONT's LAN port to the router's WAN port.

Power the Router: Turn on the router and wait for it to establish a connection with the ONT.

Configure Router Settings: Access the router's admin panel (typically via 192.168.1.1 or 192.168.0.1) and enter any ISP credentials or VLAN/PPPoE settings if required.

Tips for Optimal Performance

- Ensure the ONT is placed close to the fiber entry to minimize signal loss.
- Use high-quality Ethernet cables (Cat6a or higher) to maintain gigabit speeds.
- Avoid touching the fiber connector tips and keep dust caps on until ready to connect.
